Professor Kensak Nomoto, a member
of the faculty of the university of
Malmo, Sweden, has received the
Christopher Columbus Award in

Genoa, Italy.

The award is given annually by the city of Genoa to a person, who has contributed to the development of human society by scientific or humanistic achievements in the maritime area.

Professor Nomoto, who was formerly chairman of the department of naval architecture of Osaka university, Japan, has received the award for his work on the analysis of ship manoeuvrability and its application to ship design and automatic control of ship operation. He worked and published on these subjects between the late 1950s and the early 1970s.
