The University. . .

In recognition by the international community of the special need for advanced training for senior specialist maritime personnel, the World Maritime University, under the auspices of the International Maritime Organization, was established in July 1983 in Malmö, Sweden.

Student enrolment in the first three classes which entered the University in 1983, 1984 and 1985 has been widely distributed over 75 countries from all regions of the World.

- After satisfactory completion of two years of study at the University, 68 students from the initial class were awarded Master of Science degrees at their graduation in July 1985.
- In December 1985 a further 60 students who entered in 1984 are expected to graduate with Master of Science degrees, together with 10 students who should receive Diplomas for successful completion of one-year courses.
- A further 71 students who entered in 1985 will return to complete their second year of studies.

Once again, an excellent response is being received from the developing countries in nominating candidates and a class of approximately 100 new students is expected to enter in March 1986. Students joining the 18- and 10-week Intensive English Language Courses will join in November 1985 and January 1986 respectively.

The University has a permanent faculty of eight professors, supplemented by a highly effective visiting professor scheme where specialists prominent in a number of maritime fields lecture at WMU on specialized maritime subjects. Invaluable support is given to the University by a number of host countries who receive WMU students for field trips and periods of on-the-job training, which activities form an important part of the curriculum.
