Largest class so far enrolls at University

The class which enrolled at the World Maritime University this year is the largest so far. It consists of 85 students, compared with 72 in 1983, 65 in 1984 and 81 last year.

Six new countries are represented in the group – Burundi,

Congo, Guyana, Lebanon, Seychelles and Uruguay – bringing the total number of countries so far represented to 80.
